### EDUCATION

**Addressing:** Literacy, Life Skills, Self Awareness

**Builders:** Boy Scouts- Pushmataha Council, Boys and Girls Club of Oktibbeha County, 4-H Club, Girl Scouts-Heart of the South, Oktibbeha County Humane Society.

**United We Read:** United Way's annual event saw the collection and distribution of more than 3000 books in 2017 in an ongoing effort to promote reading and literacy in the four-county-service area.

Books were shared through a give away day, Little Libraries, community libraries, Area Agency on Aging and at the Sally Kate Winters Children's Home.

**Run United 5K:** The United Way's 5K race encourages all to run in good health and "make a difference" for their communities.
